
#### Sr. Hildegard's Change of Stability

# 2022 The Year of Two General Chapters

This year our Order, the Cistercians of the Strict Observance (a.k.a. the Trappists), held its overdue General Chapter in Assisi, Italy, in two parts. The first of these, held February 7 – 17, was for the election of our new abbot general: Dom Bernardus Peeters. (That's Dom Bernardus with us in our community photo on page 1!)

The second part was held September 2-23 to attend to other business of the Order. A highlight of this second meeting was the General Chapter's private audience with Pope Francis at the Vatican on September 16. Our Mother Vicki was thrilled to be able to greet the Holy Father in person, and we are thrilled to have such a wonderful photo of their brief encounter.

#### No Date Yet for Reopening

Hospitality is such an important part of our Benedictine-Cistercian charism. After being closed for nearly three years, we are eager to share our contemplative environment once again with those seeking a time apart for prayer and reflection. We had hoped to reopen our retreat house this past fall; however, we've been on rollercoaster ride the last few months, first with much-needed interior painting, then the roof leaked like a sieve, and then multiple heating/air conditioning units failed.

The projected cost for a new roof is \$18,990.00, and the projected cost for the new HVAC equipment is \$13,505.00, for a total of \$32,495.00.

Thanks to the generous response to our email fundraising campaign, we are close to our goal! We hope to have the new roof installed early in 2023, followed by the installation of the new HVAC units and then the necessary drywall repairs and painting.
